




URBAN CHALLENGE IDEATHONS

Solutions: Crime & Violence

Solutions for a safe and secure city should deal with, but are not limited to, any of the following aspects:

- reporting observed incidents of crime and violence
- > alert security personnel when in distress
- > receive the updates on areas to avoid or safe spaces
- create a collaborative space for the sharing of best practices



- The youth unemployment solutions should deal with, but are not limited to, any of the following aspects:
 - Alternatives for youth employment (entrepreneurship, internship, apprenticeship etc.)
 - Provide relevant tools/resources/materials to assist youth in successfully landing a job
 - Suggest/highlight career options that are in high demand (currently or in the future)
 - Provide a comprehensive list of agencies / organizations that can offer training, career development and/or job opportunities



Solutions: Climate Change & the Environment

- The environmentally friendly solutions should deal with, but are not limited to, any of the following aspects:
- promote recycling or proper garbage disposal
- promote the importance and increase need for green spaces
- offer solutions for the use of renewal energy
- offer solutions to monitor energy consumption and conservation



Solutions: Gender Based Violence

- > reporting observed cases of abuse
- foster a collaborative space for more positive interactions among women and girls
 - share the latest statistics and/or data on GBV
 - list shelters/homes where abused persons can seek refuge
 - share information on events and activities to support women most vulnerable to GBV
 - create a space where persons can request and receive help (eg. counselling, legal advice, etc.)

Solutions: Youth Participation & Civic Engagement

Solutions for the participatory city should deal with, but are not limited to, any of the following aspects:

- increase the availability of documents/reports/infographics available to the community
 - > allow citizens to make informed decisions
 - enable citizens to actively take part in the decision-making process at the community and /or constituency level
 - empower users to suggest or create their own solutions to challenges faced in their communities

The Solution



Constant Monitoring

Monitor and record the user's brain activities

Notifications

Notify the user when to take his/her medication

Data Collection

The high volume of data will be stored using big data

Data Storage

The data collected from the user will be sent to a cloud storage. Automatic Data
Synchronization

Data will be automatically synchronize to the cloud storage once the user is connected to Wi-Fi


Monitoring Brain Activity

- ☐ Seizure Guardians is a medical app and wearable device that automatically detect and monitor whenever someone is having a seizure.
- ☐ The device will alert persons around the user of the Seizure aid technique.
- ☐ The GPS navigator will allow easy tracking of the user
- ☐ The device will monitor the user's brain waves, body temperature, heart rate and blood pressure.


